



# 2021–2022 COVID-19 PROTOCOLS FOR START OF SCHOOL

## GENEVA SCHOOL *of* BOERNE

As we approach the school year, let us be reminded of what Paul writes in Philippians 2:5, “In your relationships with one another, have the same mindset as Christ Jesus.”  
**These protocols are as of August 12, 2021 and are subject to change.**

We have established a dedicated Geneva Nurses Health Line for student and family issues regarding COVID-19, as well as other medical situations. Please text or call **830-443-1775**.  
*Please refrain from using the nurses personal lines going forward for school/medical related calls, texts or transmission of medical records.*

**MASKS** Masks are **optional** on campus. In some situations, masks may be required of students and staff when traveling to other schools. Students, faculty or staff wishing to wear masks are encouraged to do so. Any student or faculty/staff member who requests a mask will be provided one.

**QUARANTINES & ISOLATION** Students, faculty and staff who have been infected will isolate for 10 calendar days from the onset of symptoms or a positive test. Please alert one of the Geneva nurses in the event of any in home positive case and isolate, if possible, from the positive person until he/she is no longer contagious.



**SYMPTOMATIC** Students, faculty and staff who are experiencing COVID-19 related symptoms should not come to school. Stay home and contact the Geneva nurses for guidance. Students at school with symptoms will be observed by Geneva nurses and sent home if symptoms warrant.



**TESTING** Rapid response testing will be provided by the Geneva nurses for the convenience and safety of our students, faculty and staff. If a surplus of kits manifests itself, we will also offer testing to parents and other members of the community.

**EXPOSURE** Contact tracing will not be conducted. Students, faculty and staff will not be required to quarantine if exposed to an infected person at school if they themselves do not have symptoms. Please note that sleepovers, team parties and other intimate gatherings of students increase exposure and should be weighed versus the risk with the current high positive rate in the area.

**NOTIFICATIONS** Parents will be notified by email of a confirmed on-campus COVID-19 diagnosis within their student’s classroom in Grammar School, by grade level if in the Logic and Rhetoric schools, and by team in Athletics.

**ON-CAMPUS INSTRUCTION** In line with the Geneva mission and Portrait of a Graduate, we will only offer on-campus instruction for students in K-12. In the event a student is absent for an extended period, faculty and the appropriate school headmaster will reach out with guidance and access to activities, assignments and assessments.
