Purpose

The purpose of this position is to support the school's mission statement by helping to develop well-rounded young men and women who demonstrate Christ-like humility and selflessness coupled with confidence and poise on the field of play.

Summary

This position performs all activities necessary to carry out the aims and objectives of the sport as outlined and directed by the Program Director. This includes emphasizing and encouraging a balanced approach to faith, family, academics and sports; providing training and coaching to enable students to perform with excellence and self-discipline for future Kingdom service; and supporting an athletic culture that demands honor and respect while representing the cause of Christ well in all its activities.

Supervision Received and Exercised

The Coach receives direction from the Head Coach and Program Director. However, personnel decisions and the formal reporting relationship will lie with the Athletic Director. The Coach must exercise judgment that is in keeping with the School's philosophy of education and sports, beliefs and values, and with the approved approach to discipline.

The Coach exercises functional supervision over student athletes, team managers, and trainers.

Work Schedule

This is a part-time, seasonal position. The exact daily work schedule is driven by practice times and team events. Travel to athletic events off campus is required.

- A mentor of students, comfortable in working with teenagers in a discipleship-oriented setting
- Experience as a player or a coach of the sport
- A holder of a Bachelor's degree or its equivalent
- In good standing with TAPPS, governing body for Geneva athletics

- Exhibit consistent Christian maturity
- Exercise wisdom, diplomacy and integrity while maintaining a high level of professionalism
- Communicate clearly and effectively, both orally and in writing
- Apply behavioral standards justly with patience and consistency
- Demonstrate commitment to the well-being of others
- Maintain highest level of confidentiality in all matters relating to students, families and fellow employees
- Take independent action where required and handle unique problems
- Multi-task with the ability to adapt quickly to changing situations
- Make decisions in emergency situations with or without the input of the RS Headmaster

- Speaking: expressing ideas by means of the spoken word to convey instructions to students, parents and other employees
- Occasional lifting of 5 to 100 pounds
- Ability to access other school facilities and offices on campus
- Movement:
 - Frequently required to jump; stretch; squat; bend; reach with arms and hands; and stand for extended periods of time
 - Occasionally required to stoop, kneel or crouch, and climb stairs
- Driving the school's buses as needed
- Maintain emotional control under stress; work prolonged or irregular hours

- Occasional lifting of up to 50 pounds
- Walking to other school buildings and offices on campus
