

SPECIAL EVENTS

Devotional Groups – Students are assigned Devo Groups to attend each day before first period. Each Devo Group is separated by gender and has students from each grade.

Sixth Grade Flag Assignments – Sixth grade students are put into pairs and assigned a week of flag duty. They should come to school at 8am to put the flags up and they will be released early from last period to take down the flags.

Service at HCDB – Two devo groups are assigned to serve on Friday mornings at Hill Country Daily Bread Ministries (HCDB). Students are dropped off at HCDB by their parents and then parent volunteers return the students to school when they are done serving.

Jogathon Pep Rally – Begins the season of raising money for financial aid. Students raise money and can earn different prizes based on what they raise.

Grandparents' Day – Grandparents are invited to attend the morning assembly and then take a tour of Logic School after. Grandparents can also stay to enjoy lunch with their grandchild.

JogaFestaHOCOthon – This is the longest and best day of the year! Parents are encouraged to be on campus all day. It begins with Jogathon where students (and parents) run to raise funds for financial aid. EagleFest is an afternoon of fun and games and proceeds go to support GCL (Geneva Community Life). The day ends with the Homecoming Football Game.

Christmas Program – Fine arts students present at a concert during the evening.

Tolkien Day – Teachers and students dress up as hobbits, dwarves and elves to celebrate J.R.R. Tolkien. This half day event is filled with food and games and parent volunteers are needed to help decorate, serve food, organize games and more.

Love Thy Neighbor – Each grade enjoys serving others in an all-school event.

Eighth Grade Oratory – Eighth grade students are assigned a portion of a speech to memorize and recite during the Oratory Preliminary Contest. The top students will then present the next school day in the Oratory Finals.

DC Trip – Eighth grade students are encouraged to attend the DC Trip in late spring. The registration process will begin in seventh grade and there are opportunities to fundraise by serving during pizza lunches on Thursdays or by serving in the concession booth during athletic events.

Flowering of the Cross – On Maundy Thursday (the Thursday before Easter), students bring a flower to school and will put it on the cross before class begins.

Benefit – On Thursday and Friday nights in the beginning of May, students present what they have learned in front of parents and grandparents or other special guests. The annual Benefit gives students an opportunity to display our wonderful curriculum while raising necessary funds for many capital and improvement projects.
