Our goal is to develop proficient readers who desire a vibrant reading life. Reading well requires time, experience, and diligence. It is important to provide leisure time for children to be inspired to read during the summer. Invest in this challenge and saturate your home with books that are true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, and praiseworthy (Philippians 4:8).

The purpose of summer reading is to continue exposing students, outside of school, to the classics - books that have stood the test of time. Students should read as many classic books as possible because they are (1) excellent in content and (2) the best tools for cultivating your child's moral imagination. The Reading Lists and a Reading Log are posted on our school website. A sample of the reading log is below.

## **READING LIST:**

Books have been chosen with the hope that students will cultivate a delight in reading and the written word. Read books from the Kindergarten, First Grade, or Second Grade lists. Only books read from these lists will count. After reaching silver medal level (550 pages), students may read *any* book of their choice. First grade students will read independently as they are able and listen to stories from adults.

HOW TO EARN A MEDAL: Reading logs must total: Gold: 750 pages, Silver: 550 pages, Bronze: 400 pages

## **READING LOGS:**

Each entry must include the title, author, number of pages read, and a 2-3 sentence summary written in complete sentences with neat handwriting. Electronic or audio books do not count. A parent must initial each book recorded on the log. See below.
