# **SCHOOL AND COMMUNITY**

Geneva School of Boerne is a classical and Christian private school serving approximately 630 students in grades 12–K-Prep. Located on 51 beautiful acres in Boerne, just north of San Antonio in the Texas Hill Country, Geneva offers students advanced learning and personal development through enriching academics and extracurricular activities.

The school was formed in 1998 and began offering classes in 1999 to 13 students in kindergarten, first and third grades. The first senior class of 19 students graduated in May 2011.

Admission to Geneva School of Boerne is selective. Decisions of admittance to the school are based on the candidate's academic record, teacher recommendations, standardized test scores, pre-admission assessments, and student and family interviews. Geneva School of Boerne admits students of any race, color, physical ability, national or ethnic origin to all rights, privileges, programs and activities, generally accorded or made available to students at the school.

Of the faculty members serving in the Rhetoric School, 60 percent hold advanced degrees. The average class size is 18 students.

Geneva's faculty is composed of dedicated educators who uphold a Christ-centered worldview and commitment to classical education. Our award-winning and accredited academics, athletics, and arts programs uphold the classical ideal by teaching students to recognize and pursue truth, goodness, and beauty in every endeavor. Students learn to evaluate ideas according to the teaching of Holy Scripture and to hold themselves to the high calling of the Christian Faith. Geneva graduates enter the world wellspoken and uniquely equipped to lead as servants, scholars, athletes, and artists in their individual contexts.

### STUDENT LIFE

At Geneva, students develop themselves inside the classroom through enriching academics and outside the classroom through service, leadership, and extracurricular activities. All Rhetoric School students serve for at least one year as an A.I.M. (Adopt, Integrate, Mentor) Leader with students in grades PK-5. Additional opportunities for leadership are given in Student Senate, National Honor Society, and a variety of clubs and competitive programs on campus. Reminiscent of traditional British boarding schools, all Rhetoric School students are assigned to one of four houses – Milton, Sayers, Chaucer, or Lewis – during their tenure at Geneva, in which they develop school spirit and a greater sense of belonging through mentorship, service, and competition.









Geneva offers a robust athletic program and competes in the Texas Association of Private and Parochial Schools (TAPPS). The school has won the Henderson Cup, the TAPPS Overall School Championship Award, 11 out of the last 14 years. In 17 years of varsity level competition, the school has celebrated 29 state championships in athletics (cross country, football, volleyball, basketball, golf, tennis, cheer and track and field) and 14 state championships in academics and fine arts (instrumental music, orchestra, vocal music and art). Additionally, Geneva students have earned the TAPPS Academic, Athlete, or Fine Arts Student of the Year 13 times.

# **ACADEMIC PROGRAM**

Given the high value placed on academics and the ability of the students, all core courses are taught at an Honors Level. Certain advanced level courses are given an additional point value weight and are indicated as such on the transcript. Due to selective admissions, Geneva does not rank its students. The school reports rank of the top 10 percent for the purpose of admission to Texas public universities.

Geneva School's curriculum is built on the classical, liberal arts tradition designed to equip students to live virtuous lives and communicate with eloquence in any discipline. The Humanities program, composed of history and literature courses, forms the cornerstone of a student's education. In Humanities courses, students discuss texts and ideas around a Harkness table that facilitates a spirit of inquiry, depth of understanding, and personal and social maturity. Geneva also offers a full range of AP coursework including AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics 1, AP Calculus AB, AP Music Theory, AP Spanish Language and Culture, AP Latin, AP United States Government and Politics and AP Computer Science A. Geneva also offers multiple dual credit courses in partnership with Colorado Christian University and the University of Texas. These advanced courses are not available to students until their junior or senior year.

### SENIOR THESIS

The Senior Thesis is the capstone to a Geneva education. The thesis program begins with each student researching a topic of his or her interest that has differing perspectives within scholarly research, publications, and public opinion. Students spend the first half of their senior year writing and refining their formal academic paper, focusing on crafting strong arguments in support of their thesis. During the second half of the year, students transform their academic paper into a persuasive oral presentation that must be memorized and delivered before an audience of faculty members, parents, students, and invited panelists. Upon completion of the oral presentation, the panelists

question the presenter upon points that have been raised, whereupon the presenter must further explain and justify claims.
