2026 SUMMER READING CHALLENGE

Our goal is to develop proficient readers who desire a vibrant reading life. Reading well requires time, experience, and diligence. It is important to provide leisure time for children to be inspired to read during the summer. Invest in this challenge and saturate your home with books that are true, noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent, and praiseworthy (Philippians 4:8).

The purpose of summer reading is to continue exposing students, outside of school, to the classics – books that have stood the test of time. Students should read as many classic books as possible because they are 1) excellent in content and 2) the best tools for cultivating your child’s moral imagination. The Reading Lists and Reading Log are also posted on our school website. A sample of a completed reading log is below.

READING LIST:

Books have been chosen with the hope that students will cultivate a delight in reading and the written word. Please read books from the 2nd or 3rd Grade lists. Only books read from these lists will count. After reaching silver medal level (600 pages), students may read *any* book of their choice, as long as the books are good, true, and beautiful like those on the Geneva list. Examples of books that will not count are *Diary of a Wimpy Kid*, *Dog Man*, and *Captain Underpants*.

WHERE TO FIND BOOKS:

Geneva School Library, Boerne Public Library, The Bookshop Under the Windmill, The Boerne Bookshop, Storyglory Kids (www.storyglorykids.com/gsbsummer; Discount Code: GSB-TAKE20), and borrow or share with friends.

HOW TO EARN A MEDAL: Reading logs must total: Gold – 800 pages, Silver – 600 pages, Bronze – 450 pages. Summer Reading medals will be awarded at the Summer Reading Awards Assembly.

READING LOGS:

Each entry must be completed in the *student’s best handwriting*, and must include the title, author, number of pages read, and a 2-3 sentence summary written in complete sentences. Electronic or audio books do not count. A parent must initial each book recorded on the log. See example below. **Reading logs must be turned in on the first day of school.** This will be the first reading homework grade for 2026/2027.
